CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

In last year's AGM report, I noted that the District was without a District Commissioner (DC), following Lesley Rutter's earlier departure. Soon after the AGM, we learned that the County Commissioner had appointed a four-person DC Team – Jo Brookbank, Michael Dreksler, Caroline O'Mahony and Chris McCann. Other commitments and other considerations meant that the latter two have withdrawn from the Team, leaving Jo and Michael to take the role forward – which they have done with energy and enthusiasm.

Prior to their appointment, Hugh Field and Caroline O'Mahony stepped up from their Assistant District Commissioner (ADC) roles to share the role of Acting District Commissioners. Both have now left the District – Caroline for Lincolnshire, Hugh for New Zealand – and I thank them both for their long-standing commitment and contribution to the smooth running of the District.

Our District Treasurer, Inga Heath, has made great progress in mastering the accounts since taking responsibility last year, and the District finances are in good health.

The District Executive Committee (DEC) has met six times since the last AGM, continuing its role of managing the District budget, managing District-held properties at Halstead, Seal and Sundridge, overseeing Group finances, responding to requests for help and advice from Groups, and selecting and helping train new and existing Leaders.

All members of the DEC have carried out their committee duties with enthusiasm, mostly in addition to their other Scouting roles, and I would like to thank them for their dedication. Here's to another year of successful Scouting in Sevenoaks!

DISTRICT COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

This year represented a year of change for Sevenoaks and it is hard to believe that so much has happened in such a short time.

Hugh took the district through the St George's Day, the Big Night Out and the AGM in 2017 before handing over to Team DC, Can we take this opportunity to thank Hugh once again for looking after the district.

The first event of the District year, as ever, was the annual St George's day parade through Sevenoaks, followed by a service including our annual awards. In 2017, the Beaver "Sajo" award went to the 1st Sevenoaks, the Cub "Mickey Spearey" award to the 17th Westerham, the Scout "Dudley Barrow" award to the 15th Otford, the Explorer "John Lane" award to Leon Sylvester and Duncan Harper. The Childsbridge award went to Lesley Rutter. The main Group award went to the 6th Kemsing. In addition we had a presentation from Duncan

Ford of the Kent County Winter Survival team, who presented the 2017 award to Felix Baker, Kelly Williams and Riana Taylor who were the only team to complete the 2017 overnight challenge.

In May, 273 Young People and adults from 7 of our 11 Groups took part in the County biennial Big Night Out. Well done to all for joining in.

Team DC started as a team of four, as we and the County Commissioner were keen to spread the load and the experience in order to make some positive changes in the District. Unfortunately Caroline O'Mahony and Chris McCann had to stand down in the new year. Our thanks go to both of them for all the work they put into Team DC.

Back in June 2017, following the last AGM, with two "All Leader" meetings to allow us to understand where things were in the District and how members wanted to see the District develop.

From those meetings a number of challenges in the District became clear –

- Members missed the Scout Shop and wanted it to re-open in the District;
- Most groups had several vacancies in their uniform and executive teams, and were finding recruitment of adult volunteers difficult;
- It was felt that many groups were losing Young people towards the end of Scouts and in the first year of Explorers;
- Communication within the District was a problem - both too much and at the same time not enough;
- The District website was looking rather out of date and unloved, (including the calendar).
- Adults and Young Leaders were not completing their training under the current scheme, and the new scheme of training for managers was going to make it harder;

We have made quiet progress on many of these through the year but of course we know we have a lot more work to be done.

- We arranged for the Regional and County team to run recruitment training.
- The District Scout Shop was re-launched back in October and has gone from strength to strength. Now being run by a team of 4 headed up by Angie Davie, it has successfully enabled online ordering for parents and Groups as well as payment by card up-front, whilst retaining the option to "try on".
- Online Scout Manager (OSM) has been the choice of many sections and Groups for some time and now the Scout Association are supporting the use of OSM. The District Executive Committee felt supporting all Groups to use this system would help with communication within the District as well as meeting the new data control rules. OSM has many more benefits but the first has been to improvement communication and transition of Young people through Scouts and Explorers by "sharing" them. Improving the management of both and retaining their interest.
- The District website and calendar has been rejuvenated and there are more plans to improve the use of both with an online booking system coming soon for District equipment.

- We are still experimenting with the best way to reach everyone with the right information. Most information is going out via GSLs, but also being published on the website and our Facebook page (where appropriate). We have also started using the Compass messaging service.
- We are looking to run more training within the district and also provide managers and training advisors with more information to help them support learners better. We are planning on providing some reminders to those learners where appropriate.

The Summer term saw many members of Sevenoaks, including ourselves, both of our District Youth Commissioner's and four Groups (3rd Riverhead, 4th St. John's, 7th Halstead and 17th Westerham) attend the Kent International Jamboree (KIJ). One Sub camp was run by our District Network Commissioner, Katie McCreadie, supported by many more Sevenoaks Leaders, demonstrating the strength of experience and enthusiasm in our District. Seven Leaders and one Young Leader supported the climbing and archery teams which led to climbing and abseil permits as well as the start of a Sevenoaks "climbing team" plus a connection to the County Climbing Team. Since then a further 11 Leaders and one Young Leader have completed County training. All of which is enabling us to deliver the climbing area at Mag7 and will provide our Young people and Leaders with many more opportunities in this coming year and beyond.

In August one of our members of Network, Riana Taylor, joined a team from Devon Scouts in an Explorer Belt expedition from Spain to France, our first Explorer Belt for over five years.

The Autumn term, for the DC team, was dominated by the 24th World Scout Jamboree (WSJ) selection process. We are delighted that over 40 fantastic young people came forward to be considered for selection which resulted in nine being selected. This is the largest number to represent Sevenoaks at a WSJ. As you will see this evening and from St. George's day, they have embraced the fundraising challenges as a team and they are reaching out to all Groups to share their journey.

Many of those that did not manage to secure a place on WSJ have signed up to join the Kent County Explorer expedition to Kandersteg in 2019 with Sevenoaks members making up approximately 1/8th of the contingent of 190.

On the back of the Jamboree selection and getting ready for the census, we had a big push to record all the Young Leaders working in the District in OSM and allow Mike Randall, Explorer Scouts (Young Leader), to offer training in-District and a light programme of activities to foster a sense of community and encourage them through their Young Leader training as well as adventurous permit training. They went climbing, were the first young people to try axe throwing and 24 of them completed their Module A in January with more sessions planned in the coming year. Also two Young Leaders completed the archery permit training.

We ended the year with an in-District permit training course for archery - increasing our permit holders by a 11 people. Plans are in place too for a second archery course for a further 11 participants, an air rifle shooting course for 11 and tomahawk/axe throwing training course for 16 all to be run in April. This has helped us get to know more Leaders

in the District, as well as generated a renewed enthusiasm for activities (water permits are next) and of course enabled us to have some fantastic support in place for Mag7.

In February the census showed that overall the District had remained broadly level - one new section opening but two closing. We are delighted that many of our Explorers have graduated to Network with two becoming our new District Youth Commissioners during the year.

We have spent a lot of the past year preparing and getting ourselves fully up to speed through the latest management training as well as attending four DC days both at HQ and County. We are starting the coming year feeling more prepared for the many challenges ahead.

Goals for the year ahead:

- Support the Group Scout Leaders in recruiting and developing their Leadership teams to deliver a quality programme for the Young people in the District.
- Training - more Leaders making progress in their training and gaining their wood badges;
- Full District team – DESC (District Explorer Scout Commissioner), teams in place to focus Cub and Scout sections, LTM (Local Training Manager), more Training Advisors.
- Embrace the new 2023 strategy into our programme “Skills for Life.”
- Lose the dubious honour of being the District in the County with the longest waiting list -according to the census we have 328 Young people of age on our lists and not in Scouting.

To our Young people, thank you for your contribution to Scouting in Sevenoaks. Nothing is impossible to achieve and in the coming year we want to increase your opportunities to lead us in the right direction to help you succeed in life.

Our volunteer members are the key to our success, we thank you all for your support and we look forward to providing the support you need to help us grow and develop the District of Sevenoaks.

Let us all do our best and make things happen together.

CUB SCOUT SECTION REPORT

We have had a very quiet year for District activities for Cubs as there was a lot of planning and preparation for MAG7.

In February the annual District Fun Quiz (previously the District Cub Challenge) was held at the 4th HQ. Unfortunately, due to other events (non-Scouting) and illness the number of teams entered was not as many as in previous years and the event was won by a team from the 4th Wildernesse Pack.

The DC's Challenge was cancelled at the last minute again due to lack of numbers but it is hoped that it will be run at some point in the forthcoming year.

The Cub Silver presentations were held in June and December, which was a combined event

with the Beaver Bronze presentations, with approximately 30 Silvers awarded over both presentations.

Preparations for MAG7 started in earnest in the middle of last year with regular monthly meetings to finalise details. The activities chosen for the Cubs will cover a diverse range, including physical challenges, as well as traditional Scouting skills and creative activities. I would like to thank Jonathan Booth from Otford and Stephanie Everest for helping prepare and support the activities planned.

I have made the decision after 4 years to step down as ADC for Cubs and would like to take this opportunity to thank the Cub Leaders across the District for the support throughout my tenure and to wish the new team all the best for the future.

EXPLORER SCOUT SECTION

Huge gratitude must go to Hugh Field for his work as District Explorer Scout Commissioner (DESC) completing 5 and half years in this role until stepping down in September 2017. The search continues for a replacement but until then the Explorer team is being supported by Jo Brookbank.

The team were joined by Dave Martin following the last AGM, who has a wealth of Scouting experience having Scouted in Somerset prior to moving to Sevenoaks.

The District Section Leader role for Young Leaders was officially filled by Mike Randall in September and the first session of Module A training for over 5 years was run in Sevenoaks in January for 24 Young Leaders alongside shooting and axe throwing just for them. Module A will now be run on a regular basis moving forward and in time other modules too. Mike is looking forward to supporting more Young Leaders through their missions and achieving the Young Leader belt award.

Thanks go to Dave Martin and Erik Barrow for being part of the World Scout Jamboree (WSJ) selection process, and then agreeing to mentor the team through their journey of fundraising to West Virginia in 2019. Thanks also go to several members of the County team that assisted the District with the selection of the largest team Sevenoaks has sent to a WSJ. Nine Young people from the age of 13 to 17 year olds will be attending. In addition, we will have 3 adults representing Sevenoaks with one contingent Leader, Simon Wood, plus Erik Barrow and Riana Taylor as members of the International Service Team.

The Spring term saw the number of Explorers increase both before the census on 31st January and then again in February with the start of a new Explorer Unit based in Halstead. The new unit has been named Puxty after a family that lived and died on the site during WWII and headed up by an existing Scout Leader, Josefine Follett, further enlarging the Explorer Leadership Team as well as enabling the Explorer provision to expand to a second night on alternating weeks at the same time as offering more weekend events too. Josefine has already made a fundamental contribution to the new style of programme.

The wider District use of Online Scout Manager has resulted in sharing older Scouts ready to transition to Explorers as well as Young Leaders with the Explorer team. This in turn has meant more effective communication of the changes and updates to the programme to all 14 to 18 year olds in the District enabling the team to offer events and activities to Young Leaders as well as those regularly attending Explorer sessions. It also enabled the sharing to all Young Leaders for both Module A training and adventurous activity permit training in archery and climbing. Three Young Leaders completed permit training during the year. Other opportunities will be progressed in the coming year which we hope will inspire more of our Young Leaders to transition into Leadership roles.

Thanks of course go to all of the Explorer Leaders who have contributed throughout the year, without you all the section would not be so successful. Thanks also to the many other adults in the District that have also supported the team over the year. With a final thanks to the Young people for embracing the changes we have made with enthusiasm and contributing so much to the programme – without you we would, of course, have no section.

COMBINED EXPLORER UNIT REPORT

Numbers across the District grew again in the course of the year and the mix of individual as well as joint meetings again proving to be a good mixer for the Explorers and the Leadership team.

There was some progress on badge-work in evidence again this year with the Survival Skills badge. After a good start with the skinning and cooking of rabbits and some backwoods living, the aim is to finish the badge with a proper backwoods camp in the coming year. Six Explorers completed the Mountain Bike badge, following the appropriate training they completed 2 separate expedition days cycling on byways, bridleways and minor roads. As it was December they certainly earned the badge! Investiture locations have varied with the Winston Churchill statue in Westerham and the Ice Rink at Bluewater.

Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) awards remain a focus with a number of Explorers achieving their Bronze awards through Explorers. Sam and Josh Odell, Daniel Hopper, Archie Wright and Ronnie Day, Tom McKeen and Ollie Hill successfully completed their award. Several also completed a Silver practice expedition. One Silver award was also completed by Riana Taylor as well as completing her Gold expedition in the Alps.

A number of Explorers were lucky enough to attend free gliding sessions at the Kent Gliding Club and those that took to the air thoroughly enjoyed the experience. The opportunity has been broadened further this year with 24 slots available to Explorers and older Scouts.

Winter Survival again featured on the calendar. This once again lived up to its description. There was only 1 team from Sevenoaks Explorers this year but they successfully defended the title, take a bow Felix Baker, Louis DeCleyn, Ronnie Day and Adam Durbaba. A double bow is in order for Felix as he was also a member of the winning team last year. The team were presented with the Trophy at St Georges Day. The further success of the team will hopefully generate more interest for next year.

For the 11th year in succession Explorers attended Gilwell 24 - offering a huge range of activities without a bed in sight over a 24 hour period. This was followed up by Scarefest again at Gilwell in October, a similar activity based event and then a more low key sleepover/programme forum in the Spring to help the new unit get to know the rest of the District. Kent International Jamboree was offered to the Explorers but as many are Young Leaders they were either camping with their Groups during the Summer period or attending KIJ as with their Group.

The Explorers are joining with the Scout programme for MAG7 as it is hoped this will inspire the next generation of Scouts to move up and continue their Scouting in Explorers.

Finally, thanks to the parents and Groups who have supported us so far and for bearing with us while we have learned and adapted to the new system, which we are continuing to tweak!

The District Scout Shop remains a valuable resource – Leaders uniform and Group items are available at a discounted cost to all Groups and the profits from uniform sales will be distributed back to Groups. Both directly benefit the Young People of Sevenoaks District Scouts. Please consider us as your first port of call for any uniform requirements, your future support is very much appreciated and our success and continued operation is down to you.
